About Childcare Choices

Childcare Choices is a cross-government campaign that aims to **make more parents aware of the financial support on offer to help them with the costs of childcare.**

While most families in the UK are entitled to some form of support, many are missing out because they simply don't know they are eligible. **And from April 2024, even more working parents can get help with their childcare costs, starting with 15 hours childcare for 2-year-olds.**

The Childcare Choices website has now been updated to allow parents to find out what they will be eligible for and when to apply. They will also be able to sign up to a newsletter which will give them further information as the expansion is rolled out.

Financial support is not limited to just nurseries and childminders. Depending on eligibility criteria, this support could also be used for **breakfast clubs; after-schools clubs; activity clubs; holiday clubs; home care workers** and **play schemes**. Support is available through Tax-Free Childcare for children up to 11, or 16 if disabled, and with Universal Credit for Childcare can help with childcare costs for children aged 0-16.

Childcare Choices: Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for.

The [Childcare Choices website](#) brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare schemes together and get the most out of it.

And from next year even more help is on the way:

- From **April 2024**, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.
- From **September 2024**, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.
- From **September 2025**, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children – from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as '**wraparound care**'.

Sample social media posts: 30 Hours Childcare

Remind working parents that they only get their 30 hours the term after their child is 3, if they've received their code through the Childcare Service. Parents also need to check their childcare account details every 3 months to keep using 30 hours. The recommended dates to apply for the next term are **30th November**, **28th February** and **31st July**. You can tag us using #ChildcareChoices and #HelpforHouseholds:

Sample social media posts: Universal Credit for Childcare

Once childcare providers have registered with the relevant regulator, working parents on Universal Credit can claim back up to 85% of their childcare costs and receive as much as £951 per month for one child or £1631 for two or more children. There is support available for parents who might need it to pay their costs upfront. Help us to inform parents and guardians on Universal Credit about this support with the following graphics and suggested accompanying messages that you can edit and use on your own channels. Childcare support offers

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Childcare support expansion offer

**From April 2024:
15 hours childcare –
Age 2**

- For **eligible working families in England**
- Each parent earning **under £100k per year** and **at least £167** per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage)
- With a **2-year-old child**
- **15 hours of childcare** or early education for **38 weeks**
- A total of **570 hours per year**, that you can use flexibly with one or more childcare providers

**From September 2024:
15 hours childcare –
Ages 9 - 23 months**

- For **eligible working families in England**
- Earning **under £100k** and **at least £167** per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage)
- With a **child between 9 and 23 months old**
- **15 hours of childcare** or early education for **38 weeks**
- A total of **570 hours per year**, that you can use flexibly with one or more childcare providers

**From September 2025:
30 hours childcare –
Ages 9 - 23 months**

- For **eligible working families in England**
- Earning **under £100k** and **at least £167** per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage)
- With a **child between 9 and 23 months old**
- **30 hours of childcare** or early education for **38 weeks**
- A total of **1,140 hours per year**, that you can use flexibly with one or more childcare providers

The government is also working to deliver its ambition for all parents of primary school aged children, who need it, to be able to access childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, which is known as '**wraparound care**'.

Parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of wraparound care from September 2024.

Existing childcare support packages - 1/2

The eligibility criteria of the different forms of government childcare support packages that parents can access are as follows:

Tax – Free Childcare

- For **working families**, including the self-employed, **in the UK**
- Earning **under £100k** and **at least £167** per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage) each
- Who **aren't** receiving Tax Credits, Universal Credit or childcare vouchers
- With children aged 0-11 (or 0-16 if disabled)
- For every £8 they pay into an online account, the government will add an extra £2, **up to £2,000 per child per year (or up to £4,000 per child if disabled)**

Can be accessed through your registered providers and childminders who have activated their Tax-Free Childcare accounts.

Universal Credit Childcare

- For working families claiming Universal Credit, **in England, Scotland, and Wales**. Northern Ireland has separate arrangements. Eligibility criteria apply
- **Both parents working** – unless one of the allowable exceptions is met
- With **children usually under 17 (including disabled)**
- Up to 85% of eligible childcare costs can be reclaimed
- Upfront support is available to fund your first month's payment. Ask your Work Coach for more information
- Tax-Free Childcare is not available if also claiming Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, Universal Credit or childcare vouchers

Can be accessed through registered providers or childminders.

Existing childcare support packages - 2/2

15 hours childcare – Age 2 receiving additional government support

- For families in **England**, receiving some forms of additional government support. Visit [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) for further information.
- With **2-year-old children**
- **15 hours of childcare** or early education for **38 weeks**
- A total of **570 hours per year**, that they can use flexibly with one or more childcare provider
- **If you are a childcare provider, speak to your local authority if you are interested in delivering the entitlements.**

15 hours childcare - Ages 3 & 4

- **For all families in England** with **3 and 4-year-old children**
- **15 hours of childcare** or early education for **38 weeks**
- A total of **570 hours per year**, that they can use flexibly with one or more childcare provider
- **If you are a childcare provider, speak to your local authority if you are interested in delivering the entitlements.**

30 hours childcare – Ages 3 & 4

- For **working families in England** with **3 and 4-year-old children**
- **30 hours of childcare** or early education for **38 weeks**
- A total of **1,140 hours per year**, that they can use flexibly with one or more childcare provider
- **If you are a childcare provider, speak to your local authority if you are interested in delivering the entitlements.**

Parents might be eligible to use more than one childcare schemes together.
