Swimming - reminder

Starting the first week back, on Wednesday 8th January, we are taking our Year 2 to 6 children swimming for eight double sessions at Selby Leisure Centre with a fantastic fifty minutes learning time in the water. This is a real selling point of our small school. It is part of the National Curriculum that children have to be able to swim 25 metres by the time they leave primary school in Year 6. Bigger primaries tend to take their pupils swimming once during their primary school career, usually in Year 4 as a class group. We are pleased to be able to offer this every two years in the spring term so that each child, by the end of Year 6, would have had at least two opportunities to attend swimming lessons.

We are subsidising the cost of the pool hire, instructors and the transport from the schools budget and through a donation from FOBSS and we are requesting a parental donation of £4 per session, payable weekly or in full on ParentPay. If you haven't already returned the swimming letter emailed and sent home on 5th December, it's really important this is returned by Tuesday 7th January so that your child can be assigned to the correct ability group.

Young Voices - reminder

It's nearly time for the Young Voices concert at Sheffield Arena! The children will be travelling on a coach, leaving just after lunchtime on Tuesday 7th January 2020. The children spend the afternoon rehearsing the songs and then eat their pack up for tea.

The suggestion from school is that each child has a hot school lunch before departing and then brings a pack up tea and a drink in a named disposable bag. They will need to come to school dressed in their Young Voices t-shirt with their school jumper or cardigan over the top and will need a coat. They should wear black or grey trousers or leggings and comfortable shoes. Parents are to make their own way there, ready for a start time of 7.00pm. Please be aware that the area around the arena does get busy and to allow plenty of time to get there and park. Car parking is available to pre-book and more information is available here - https://www.flydsaarena.co.uk/home Last year, we were informed that the event was cashless, so if you are planning to purchase merchandise or food and drink, please take a card with you. The event finishes at 9.00pm so we expect the children to return to school by approximately 10.15pm. For safeguarding reasons, parents and children are kept completely separate at the arena including access to the toilet facilities and priority goes to the school coaches departing the car park over parent cars. Your child must travel home on the bus with the rest of the school party.

As the children will be late to bed, we give permission for children attending the Young Voices concert and their siblings to come to school the next morning by the later time of 10.30pm should they wish.
