Class 1



They are also running a Rugby after-school club on Tuesdays up until Easter.

Burton Salmon Sensory Room

We are very excited to announce that we have a new purpose made sensory room on site, located within the building adjacent to the nature area. The sensory room was made possible because of a grant from the Lady Elizabeth Hastings' Education Foundation, to whom we are extremely grateful. We are adding the finishing touches to the room and anticipate a grand unveiling after Easter. As a school we value the wellbeing of all our children and the sensory room will allow staff to deliver focused input based around

wellbeing, mental health and sensory needs. With the help of the grant we will be able to dedicate space to this much needed and valued area of child development. The room boasts various multi-sensory pieces of equipment such as aromatherapy, interactive fibre optic lighting, light up lava mats, infinity mirrors, and a cocoon bean bag to name a few. Mrs Hall is also working hard to overhaul part of the grounds next to the building to create a sensory garden. This garden will complement the sensory room and allow sensory input outdoors. We will keep you updated about the progress of this project and the unveiling in due course.
