
How to Install the Web App

To install on an iPhone and iPad:


- View the website via Safari

New 'Golden' behaviour award system in school

This term we have made some exciting enhancements to our behaviour policy. To raise the profile of expected behaviours within school, we have spoken to the children about behaviours we think are important for good learning. These include: being ready to learn, being respectful, and being safe. We have also shared with the children the importance of team working and resilience.

In our special mention assembly on Fridays, one child from each of the 3 classes is chosen to receive the golden cushion or golden throw (or a gold star badge to wear) and they will keep this for the whole week. These items are awarded to a child who has shown exceptional conduct in one or more of the above areas. We are also awaiting delivery of some very special golden stickers to support these behaviours!

School drop-offs and collections

A polite reminder that staff are only insured to be in the playground on a morning, from 8.50am. All children must be supervised until the doors open please. Equally, at home-time, please can families who are waiting to collect older children, ensure that they supervise any toddlers with them. This includes not playing on school equipment, thank you.

For the Pippins Breakfast Club, Miss Northway will open the main School Reception door at 8am. **Children must be brought to the door by an adult and handed over to her or another member of staff; please do not park on the road and allow your child to enter the school grounds by themselves.** And for the Orchard After-school club, in Class 1, please knock or ring and your children will be brought to the main school Reception door by Mrs Laycock, to be collected and signed out by Parents/Carers. Outstanding ParentPay debts

Please could parents and carers ensure that any outstanding ParentPay debts are cleared as soon as possible. Across the federation, there is an agreed maximum debt per child, which is £30.00. This includes any school dinners, trips, and out of school club payments. With Orchard out of school club sessions, it has become apparent that payments are not being met weekly. Should any outstanding balances not be cleared by **Friday 27th March**, there is the risk that your child will be unable to use the OOSC facilities.
